1. The Minister of Transport reported on certain legislation proposed for introduction at the next session.

It was recommended that a bill be introduced to provide for control and regulation of interprovincial and international pipe lines used for transporting oil or natural gas. The Board of Transport Commissioners would be charged with administration of the Act.

It was also recommended that a bill be introduced to amend the Canadian National - Canadian Pacific Act of 1933 to place railway hotels and their
