Ce que je sais de la possession du demandeur Mr. Brown à titre de propriétaire, je le sais pour l'avoir entendu dire.

Le quai peut-être à cinq ou six arpents plus bas que le moulin. Je n'ai pas mesuré. Il y a un chemin du moulin qui conduit à ce quai. Je connais ce quai depuis vingt-cinq ou trente ans. Il y a un autre chemin pour se rendre à ce quai là que celui qui y conduit du moulin.

Les présentes notes de témoignage étant duement lues au témoin, il y persiste déclarant qu'elles contiennent la vérité et déclarant ne savoir signer.

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### Preuve à la part du Demandeur contestant l'Intervention.

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GEORGE BISSET, of the City of Quebec, in the District of Quebec, proprietor of foundry, aged sixty years, being duly sworn upon the Holy Evangelists, doth depose and say:

I do know the parties in this cause; I am not related, allied or of kin, to, nor in the service or domestic of either of them or interested in the event of this suit.

I was tenant of the Beauport mills from May eighteen hundred and thirty-four for four years and some months.

As such I was in possession of the grounds on the South Western Bank of the river comprising the building and wharf situate on the said south western bank.

The wharf just mentioned is the same as that described in the declaration in this cause and the same used in my time and ever since, I believe, for the purposes of the mill.

When I was there, it was generally called "McCallum's wharf" but afterwards "Fortin's wharf," named after the subsequent proprietor.

I understand that the proprietors of the mill have always had possession and use of the said wharf since the year eighteen hundred and thirty four. I had it, as tenant of the Beauport mills, for four years and some months as above mentioned.

John Gordon and Company had possession of it after me.

That property, I understand is the same as that described in the second page of the deed of sale of the nineteenth of October eighteen hundred and forty-three, filed in this cause and marked exhibit of Intervening party B.
