GOSSIP.

Messrs. T. & H. Shore, White Oak, Ont., have had a very successful season with their poultry. Orders have been filled very satisfactorily. All breeding pens carefully mated.

Messrs. Shore Bros., White Oak, Ont., report very brisk business in Shorthorns, having disposed of some bulls and heifers of good Scotch breeding. Worth of special mention is a sale to Messrs. S. & C. Charlton, Springfield, Ont., of one extra fine young bull and cow and calf; an aged bull (Diamond Prince) to Mr. John Ferguson, St. Thomas, Ont. Diamond Prince has headed their herd for several years and has proved a grand stockgetter. He was got by Prime Minister, winner at World's Fair, Chicago.

The American Oxford Down Sheep Record Association will offer \$75 in special prizes at each State and Provincial fair in the U. S. and Canada where the Oxford breed is allowed a separate class in 1899. The money will be divided as follows: Best yearling ram—\$15, second \$10; best pen of 4 lambs, either sex—\$15, second \$10. All stock competing for these prizes to be bred and owned by the exhibitor in the State or Province; to be registered in the American Oxford Down Record, bear the A. O. D. R. A. Ear Tag, and Certificate of Registry, under seal of the Association, presented at time of exhibition. Where there is but one exhibitor, but one prize will be paid. The secretary is W. A. Shafer, Middletown, O.

The American Shropshire Registry Association will offer the following special prizes at Canadian shows in 1899: At Toronto, London, and Winnipeg, for best flock of registered Shropshires (1 ram and 3 ewes), all to be American-bred and owned by exhibitor at least ten days before showing, \$20; for best 4 registered Shropshire lambs (1 ram and 3 ewe lambs), to be bred and owned as above, \$15. At Halifax, Montreal, and Ottawa, on the same terms and classification, \$15 and \$10. The Provincial Fat Stock Show of Ontario, 1899, grand sweepstake premium of the show, if won by registered Shropshire sheep, \$50; best registered Shropshire wether, one year old and under two, first premium \$10, second \$5; best registered Shropshire wether, under one year old, first premium \$10, second \$5; extra special premiums for best wether, sired by registered Shropshire ram, out of grade ewes, one year old and under two, first premium \$10, second \$5; under one year old, first premium \$10, second \$5.

REID & CO.'S AYRSHIRES AND TAMWORTHS.

The firm of Reid & Co., whose farm at Hintonburg, Ont., is within a short distance of the Experimental Farm at Ottawa, is well supplied with pure-bred dairy stock. This season their spacious stables are taxed to their utmost with Ayrshire cows and their progeny, and it has been a well-known fact that the firm have always attached much importance to their breeding stock, which a short review of the present herd will show. Their stock bull, Gold King 1387, is the six-year-old son of the renowned Nollie Osborne 2018, by Chieftain of Barcheskie (Imp.) 1128, and of his conformation it is needless to dwell beyond the fact that his dam never had a poor one, and that all her sons were selected to head good herds. After doing five seasons of valuable service at Reid's, he goes to the Scotch Hill and Lyons Brook Agricultural Societies in Nova Scotia, where he will probably remain the balance of his days, and the vacancy is being filled by the royally-bred and handsome Duke of York 2nd 2301, lately purchased from his importer, Mr. Robt. Davies, Toronto, and in his hands he landed the 1st prize, as a yearling in Toronto in 1898. His dam, Clara 3rd of Balmowat, was a Royal and Highland Society winner and is credited with producing 62 lbs. milk per day, so that in his purchase we would consider the herd's strength is maintained. He was bred by James Young, Francis Young, Balmowat, Ballantrae, Scotland, and has for sire Duke of York of Hillhouse (2864). Among the matrons we feel at liberty to mention specially the nine-year-old cow Lady Maggie 6013, by Golden Guinea 4454, out of Florina 3552, as producing the present stock bull at the Central Experimental Farm, by Matchless. She carries a large, well-formed udder and has been a regular producer. Her 5-mos. son by Gold King should attract the attention of parties requiring a well-bred young sire.

Williamia of Burnside 6280, by Nelson 5038, and out of Jessie of Burnside 6012, is rising six years and has already proven herself capable of producing over 55 lbs. of milk in a single day. Emergency of Burnside 8755, by Golden Guinea 4454, and out of Woodside Countess 3709, was dropped in '92 and has developed into a splendid cow, possessing the dairying qualities of the descendants of her worthy sire, of which the herd is largely composed, being true in type and uniform in size, markings and quality. In the herd are half a dozen each of yearlings and two-year-olds that give exceptional promise and at their next mating with Duke of York 2nd some sensational showyard individuals may be looked for. A good herd each of Tamworth and Berkshire swine command a good portion of attention. At present the firm have seven Tamworth brood sows from the herds of J. C. Nichol and H. George & Son. The stock boar, Amber King 976, by Amber Luther 245 and out of Maud 226, is just one year old. He was selected on account of his extra length and superior quality, coupled with his strength of bone, and in strong competition at the leading fairs was always placed among the money-winners. Red Fellow 879, by Rex 177, and out of Red Lady 645, was farrowed on the farm two years ago and employed on many of the best unrelated sows. He has had a successful career in the showing, landing 1st when under a year and the same honors a year later, as well as at all local competitions. His dam is considered one of the best sows ever owned by the firm.

In the Berkshire pens we saw half a dozen brood sows, purchased from the herds of Snell and Green, and of late arrival are a pair of choice young sows lately purchased from Mr. George Green, and which have been bred to Columbus 5th 4111, the stock boar at the Experimental Farm. Mr. Smith, the manager, reports a very active demand for all stock and in many cases orders were received when there was no stock on hand to fill them. The firm have come to fully realize that this is a live-stock producing country, and in order to be in position to meet the demands they are constantly adding new blood of the most approved sort to meet their customers' wants, besides new individuals of merit to their long list.
