

Closing Exercises of St. Patrick's Academy.

The pupils of St. Patrick's Academy, Alexander street, held their closing exercises on the afternoon of June 22nd, in the new Academic Hall, when a large number of their parents and friends had gathered to witness the distribution of honors, medals and prizes to the 425 pupils attending the school. The Rev. pastor of St. Patrick's presided, attended by the Rev. Fathers O'Reilly, P. Heffernan, J. Killoran, F. Singley, also of St. Patrick's, Rev. Father Brophy, of Outremont, Rev. Fr. Ouellette, of St. James, the Rev. Provincial of the Congregation de Notre Dame, and several religious from the Mother House.

The musical programme was pronounced above the average, and the valedictory, a retrospect of the school year, participated in by the thirteen graduates, received very high praise, the poem being classified as an epic. Special reference was made therein to the recent modeling and enlarging of the school itself, to the annual alumnae meeting, to the visit of His Eminence Cardinal Logue, etc., etc., while an affectionate tribute was paid to Alma Mater. The programme closed with Moore's "Farewell, But Whenever you Welcome the Hour." Rev.
