THE CANADIAN NORTH-WEST

HOMESTEAD

REGULATIONS.

Any even numbered section of Dóminion Lands in Manitoba or the North-West Territories, excepting 8 and 26, which has not been homesteaded, or reserved to provide wood lots for settlers, or for other purposes, may be homesteaded upon by any person who is the sole head of a family, or any male over 18 years of age, to the extent of one quarter section, of 160 acres, more or less.

ENTRY.

ENTRY.

Entry may be made personally at the local land office or the district in which the land to be taken is situate, or if the homesteader desires, he may, on application to the Minister of the Interior, Ottawa the Commissioner of Immigration, Winnipeg, or the local agent for the district in which the land is situate receive authority for some one to make entry for him. Yee of \$10.00 is charged for a homestead entry.

HOMESTEAD DUTIES.

A settler who has been granted an entry for a homestead is required by the provisions of the Dominion Lands Act and the amendments thereto to perform the conditions connected therewith, under one of the for owing plans:—

(4) If the settler has his permanent residence upon farming land owned by him in the vicinity of his homestead, the requirements of this Act as to residence dence may be satisfied by residence upon the said

The term "vicinity" used above is meant to indi cate the same town, township or an adjoining or cornering township.

A settlet who avails himself of the provisions of Clauses (2), (3) or (4) must cultivate 30 acres of himmestead, or substitute 20 head of stock, with buildings for their accommodation, and have besides & acres substantially fenced.

The privilege of a second entry is restricted by law to those settlers only who completed the dutie-upon their first homesteads to entitle them to patent on or before the 2nd June, 1889.

Every homesteader who fails to comply with the

requirements of the homestead law is liable to have his entry cancelled, and the land may be again thrown open for entry.

APPLICATION FOR PATENT

should be made at the end of three years, before the Local Agent, Sub-Agent, or the Homestead In sector. Before making application for patent the settler must give six months, notice in writing to the Commissioner of Dominion Lands, at Ottawe f his intention to do so.


