

Friday, 8th February, 1811.

AN engrossed Bill, for granting another sum of money to finish the building of the Common Gaol for the District of *Montreal*, was read for the third time.

On motion of Mr. *Papineau*, junior, seconded by Mr. *Durocher*;

RESOLVED, that the Bill do pass, and that the title be, An Act for granting another sum of money to finish the building of the Common Gaol for the District of *Montreal*.

ORDERED, that Mr. *Papineau*, junior, do carry the Bill to the Legislative Council, and desire their concurrence.

The order of the day, for putting the question of concurrence on the amendments reported by a Committee of the whole House, to the Bill to continue and amend an Act passed in the forty-seventh year of His Majesty's reign, intituled, "An Act to regulate the Provincial Post Houses, and to repeal certain Acts and Ordinances therein mentioned," being read;

The first to the fifteenth of the said amendments, inclusive, were again severally read, and the question of concurrence being separately put upon each, they were agreed to by the House.

The sixteenth of the said amendments being again read, and the question of concurrence put thereon, the House divided, and the names being called for, they were taken down, as follows:
