May it please Your Excellency.

Address to His Exceilency.

IS Majesty's faithful Subjects the Representatives of the Province of Nova-Scotia, beg leave to represent, that the Inhabitants of the Town of Halifax, and all those settled upon the Harbour thereof, are under great apprehensions from the insecure Situation of His Majesty's Magazine of Gunpowder at the Eastern "Battery, which contains at this Time feveral Thousand Barrels, and " being a Wooden Building with a Shingle Roof, situated on the " the Verge of the Woods, which in the Summer Season are ever " liable to be set on Fire, and recent Instances have occurred in "Consequence of accidental Fire happening in the neighbouring "Woods, that has justly occasioned great Alarm, and might have

been attended with the most dreadful Consequences to the Town " and Neighbourhood of Halifax, but for the timely Interpolition of " His Majesty's Troops, and Providence.

"We having the fullest Confidence in Your Excellency's Atten-"tion to the Tranquility and Safety of the Lives and Properties of

"His Majesty's faithful Subjects have no doubt, that you will speed-" liy Concert such Measures as will effectually remove all Uneasiness

" with Regard to the Magazine, so as to have the Powder lodged in " fuitable Buildings, that are the most secure from external Fire, and

" in Situations as remote from the Town as may be convenient for "His Majesty's Service, or in such small Parcels, as to lessen the

" Danger, from any accidental Explosion."

Resolved, That the said Address be presented to His Excellency by. Resolution thereon. a Committee of this House.

> Ordered, That Mr. Wallace, Mr. Morris and Mr. Pyke, be a Committee for that Purpose.

Ordered, That the Clerk do wait upon His Excellency to know when he will be pleased to receive the above Address.
