ANNUAL MEETING OF PARIS Y.M.C.A.

Successful Year of Work Was Reported by the Various Departments

(From our own Correspondent)
Paris, June 7.—The annual meeting of the Y. M. C. A. was held in the auditorium last evening. The president, Mr. J. R. Inkster, presided, and Rev. E. J. Seton-Adamson opened the meeting with prayer. The following compose the board for the ensuing year: Messrs. J. R. Inkster, C. E. Windus, H. A. Crooks, T. C. Munn, Henry Rehder, C. M. Wells, and the new directors are Messrs. Robert Gorrie, E. V. Kinsey and G. Miller.

The treasurer's report showed the Y. M. C. A. to be in a good state financially. The total receipts were \$2,433.97, with a disbursement of

\$2,385.93, leaving a balance on hand of \$48.04. There are a number of subscriptions promised that have not been available during the year, while collectible subscriptions outstanding amount to \$115. Against this is an invoice passed by the board for \$26.54, making a net surplus April 30th of \$36.50. When this is added to the cash surplus, the total to the good of the association is \$136.40.

The report of the Ladies' Auxiliary for the year showed that as usual the ladies had been very busy, and at the same time very successful. Among some of the principal items, the janitor's rooms had been redecorated; supper had also been provided for the teams working in the British Red Cross campaign. When the boys' work conference was held in March, the ladies also catered for the banquet in connection with the same, and after paying all expenses, had paid over \$30 to the committee in charge. Generous contributions had also been made during the year

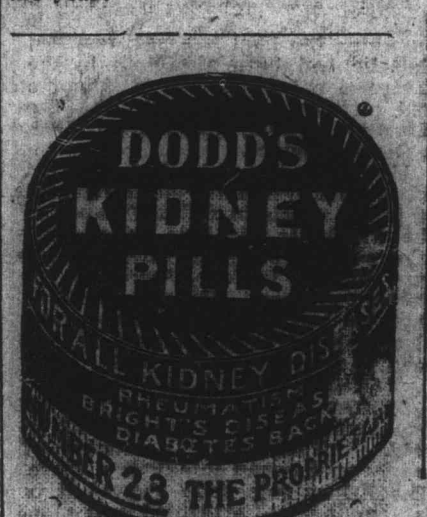
to the Canadian Patriotic Fund, Red Cross Society, Belgium Relief and the Overseas Y. M. C. A. In April the Auxiliary, together with the W. C. T. U. put on a "pageant of Famous Women" from which \$175.90 was sent to provide hot coffee, cocoa and soup to the soldiers overseas. By request, this was repeated, when some \$42 was handed to the Red Triangle Fund campaign. At Christmas the "Y" boys overseas were remembered, when 54 boxes were sent to France. During the past year, two of the "Y" boys have made the supreme sacrifice, Corporal Barker and J. B. Findlay. A tribute was also paid to the late Mrs. Mitchell who recently moved to Brantford. In her successor, Mrs. Dr. Dunton, they feel they have a capable officer.

The general secretary's report was very encouraging. There were three C. S. E. T. classes meeting in the "Y" two Methodist and one Anglican, with an average attendance of 14. The "4-U-and-1" class met every Sunday morning up to April 30th of

each year, and at the closing session Mr. B. Barker presented 14 certificates to members who had attended 75 per cent of the meetings.

Father and son week was duly observed in town, and a union banquet held on April 6th, after which T. R. Best addressed a public meeting. The second boys' work conference held on March 1st, 2nd and 3rd, was very successful, when some 140 delegates were enrolled. Reference was also made to the large number of meetings held in the Y. M. C. A. for different religious matters by various bodies in town. A local advisory committee for co-operation in boys' work has also been formed in town. The physical work, as also the gym classes were well attended, their hours being 30 each week. Since May, two baseball teams have been organized, who practice in the Agricultural grounds on evenings and Saturday afternoons. Some forty new members have been added to the gym during the year. Secretary G. A. Veigel, in closing, thanked Messrs. Burt, Barker, Austin, Dun-

ton, Ernest Edgington, and Ralph Nichol, and all others who had assisted in the work of the "Y" during the year.



CHILD'S ONE PIECE PAJAMAS

A very sensible style for a night garment suitable for a small child is shown in No. 8763. It is in kimono style, with sleeves shirred in at the elbows. The neck is drawn in on a ribbon cap through creases. The Empire waist line is formed by running a ribbon through a wide casing with a pretty bow tied at the front. The long pantalettes are also shirred on elastic at the ankles, forming a narrow ruffle. Cotton crepe, batiste, long cloth or nainsook may be used for making the pajamas.

The child's one piece pajamas No. 8763 are cut in three sizes—small, medium and large. The medium size requires 3 yards 27 inch or 36 yard 30 or 40 inch material, with 1 1/2 yards narrow ribbon and 2 1/2 yards wide ribbon.
