William Hall, of Horton Bluff, the colored man who won the Victoria Cross during the Indian Rebellion, died on Thursday of last week, aged in town on Saturday last, en route for a short wist to relatives at Canam and elsewhere in the country. Arr Wittens of Lucknow he was one of a squad of mariners who voluntees of town a weet difficult service, and he received the 'cross' for standing to his gan while the company were engaged in blowing open a gate to make an entrance into the city. He and another man were left alone to work the gun, their comrades having been killed, and by their pluck and persverance succeeded in effecting an entrance for the British trops. At the time of the visit of the Duke of York to Halifax he visited the city and was kindly received by His Royal Highness. He is said to have been the only colored man who ever held the coveted Victoria Cross. He was unmarried and lived with two sisters, Mra Robinson and Miss Rachel Hall. The funeral took place on Saturday, burial being made at the Brooklyn cemetry, near Lockhartville.
