Our New Station

All our organizations here have been boasting for the new Station and we believe we are safe in saying that the Lethbridge Supt. of the railroad is in sympathy with this much needed improvement.

Mayor Mark Spencer, however, who wrote the Vice-President of the C. P. R. at Winnipeg, Mr. D. C. Coleman, urging the early building of the station, has just received a letter in reply stating that owing to the general financial conditions existing the big railway

was pursuing a policy of retrenchment on capital expenditure, and therefore no definite statement could be given out as to this new work.

However we shall still live, in hopes that the good season before us and the preparation for the traffic incident to the dedication of the Temple will induce the Canadian Pacific railway to take up this matter again and act favorably upon it.

When?

We see that our neighboring towns are arranging their "clean-up" days, and we are wondering when the date for Cardston is to be named. Shall we wait until the first half-holiday? The "Globe" would prefer to see the time spared earlier for such work. However it would not be wise to break in on

seeding operations and we think none of the farmers will do so. The town folk though could all arrange to do up the spring cleaning earlier, and all that is needed is the agreement on the time and then the necessary advertising so all will understand it.

Join The Civic Club

The Civic Club is not a kickers Club, it is a Boosters club. Why was it ever organized? To create in Cardston a civic consciousness and a civic pride. To arouse a keen interest in all civic matters, especially in the conscious and intelligent use of the ballot was the primary purpose of the civic club organization. None of the promoters ever dreamed it would be a permanent organization when it was first thought of, but they felt that the interest created in the municipal elections last December justified a more substantial organization which would have a broader field in which to work. Accordingly the civic club was duly organized under a constitution, at the beginning of the year, having for its avowed objects the furthering of all good movements tending to help Cardston and the backing up to the limit, of our municipal officers in their task of overseeing and planning the good of Cardston.

Although some people have looked at the club otherwise and have endeavored to discredit its work, yet the record of the past three months shows that the club has consistently stood behind its aims and objects and has worked wholly for the betterment and improvement of Cardston. Furthermore it has been in-puted that only a few are endeavoring to dictate what the town shall do, but this doesn't stand either, for all proposed actions of the club are passed upon by its members (some 50 or more) before they are carried to the public, and the membership is open to any booster of Cardston, male or female, and you are invited to come in and make your influence help put Cardston to the front.

What has the civic club done? The civic club didn't put over the election last December but it was undoubtedly responsible for the largest vote ever polled in a municipal election in Cardston. The club had its candidates, but

it never prevented or tried to persuade any other candidates from entering the field. Also the club never put through the graveling of our streets, but they got behind the Mayor and council in the move and did you know that Mrs. Carlson and Miss Nielson, of the civic club, were appointed by the club, to have all arrangements in charge for feeding the men for the 4 days and that every man on the executive of the club worked on committees in connection with this work. Of course as citizens, not a single civic club member failed in the work during the four days.

Then the cow-herd. The club, not even the executive, were unanimous as to the solution of the Cow problem on the streets of Cardston. One thing everyone agreed on however, was that cows and trees, lawns and well kept premises, do not get along together, and that the responsibility of the cows must be on the owners of the cows. The Town pound law must be enforced, if the beautifying of our little city is to ever take place. If the owners want a herd, they are responsible, if they can find other means of keeping cows in town so they do not infringe on their neighbors all well and good, but the Civic Club maintains that Cardston's streets should be cow-less both day and night.

Now we are not endeavoring to either boost the Civic Club unduly or to bolster it up in any of its actions, but we believe it is a good organization for every live man and woman in Cardston to join. We commend it to you. It has a big program on for the coming year, but it can only carry out that program if the citizens are behind it and with it. No few people can do anything in any community. Let every individual feel his responsibility to his own town and come to the Civic Club meeting—the second Monday night in every month.
