

SYNOPSIS OF CANADIAN NORTH

WEST LAND REGULATIONS THE sole head of a family, or any male ower 18 years old may home-stead a quarter-section of available Dominion land in Manitoba, Saskat-Dominion land in Manicota, Sastat-chewan or Alberta. Applicant must appear in person at the Dominion Lands Agency or Sub-Agency for the District. Entry by proxy may be made at any Dominion Lands Agency (but not Sub-Agency), on certain

conditions Duties-Six months residence upon and cultivation of the land in each of three years. A homesteader may live within nine miles of his homestead on a farm of at least 80 acres on certain conditions. A habitable house

is required except where residence is performed in the vicinity. Live stock may be substituted for cultivation under certain conditions.
In certain districts a homesteade in good standing may pre-empt a quarter-section alongside his home-stead. Price \$3.00 per acre.

-Six months residence in each of three years after earni homestead patent; also 50 acres exmay be obtained as soon as homestrad
patent, on certain conditions.

A settler who has exhausted his
