CONTRACTORS' AGENT TELLS HIS SIDE OF CASE

Workmen Hired in Winnipeg by Foley, Welch and Stewart Arraigned Before Inspector Worsley, Charged With Breach of Their Contracts.

John Ross, Tom Fenton, A. Allison, D. Murphy, F. Rose, J. Bushea and Wm. Manning, the seven men who were arrested yesterday at Edmonton on a charge of breaking contract with their employers, Foley, Welch and Stewart, came before Inspector Worsley at the R.N.W.M.P. Barracks this morning.

The case was adjourned until tomorrow night, in order that the Corporation of Winnipeg, as far as Wolf Creek, should be able to get the necessary evidence.

At the hearing this morning, Geo. Latta, an agent of Foley, Welch & Stewart, who accompanied the men from Winnipeg as far as Wolf Creek, stated that the men had signed contracts at Winnipeg to work on construction west of Edmonton on the Grand Trunk Pacific.

No complaints were received from any one until the train arrived at Edmonton. Here there was some trouble, as some of the men wanted to leave the train to buy food.

Did They Have Enough Grub? "Did the men have sufficient grub on the journey?" asked Inspector Worsley.

"If they did not it was their own fault, as the train stopped at all terminals, and grub was obtainable."

"The cars were locked at Edmonton, were they not?" asked J. A. Clarke, lawyer for the defence.

"Yes, we locked them as we feared the men would leave when they got to Edmonton."

"When the men have no money what do you do to provide food for them?"

"It is the usual custom for the men to provide their own food, but when a man has no money we feed him and deduct so much from his first month's wages."

Contracts Produced. The contracts of the men were then produced in court in which it was stated that the men were employed to work in the vicinity of Edmonton.

"How were the men treated when they arrived in Edmonton?" asked Mr. Clarke.

"They were given supper, lodging and breakfast, and after they had their grub they were taken to work and started back for Edmonton."

"How do you know how they were treated or what they did at Edmonton?"

"I was not there, but I received a message from the agent at Edmonton stating what had been done to the men."

"That is not evidence, it is merely hearsay."

Mr. Clarke then stated that he was prepared to bring on witnesses who would swear that the men received nothing but the best of treatment, and that they were well paid.

Inspector Worsley thought that there was no evidence to show that the men had refused to work.

Adjourned the Case. "I will adjourn the case until tomorrow evening in order that witnesses who were present when the men were arrested may be brought to work-brought to Edmonton," said Inspector Worsley.

NISFAI EX-MAYOR DIED SUDDENLY

Himself Slightly With a Knife in His Side and Almost Immediately Afterwards Expires—Was Police Chief, Mayor of the Town.

Minneapolis, Sept. 28.—The town today was startled by the sudden death of one of its leading individuals, A. B. Nisfai, ex-mayor of town. It appears that on returning to his home he was shot about the seat down on a bench upon which there had been inadvertently a small sharp knife which he had been in cutting leather, which struck his thigh.

Without being in any way a very serious wound, the doctor was called, but the wound was so deep and the blood so freely flowing that he was unable to do anything but to rest, and almost immediately afterwards expired.
