TO CRUSH THE REVOLUTION. Caracas, Feb. 16.-Since early yesterday morning Venezuelans have been awaiting impatiently the official inti-mation that the blockade has been This morning, however, the British man-of-war Tribune was still at La Quaira enforcing the blockade and preventing the fishermen from leaving the harbor. The Government was puzzled until at 11 o'clock the news reached Caracas that the captain of the Tribune had notified the authorities at La Guaira that the blockade was raised. At 3 o'clock today the Tribune left for Trinidad. The news received from all Venezuelan ports except Coro and Higuerot is that the foreign warships sailed away today. The Government received the news that the blockade had been raised, and sent harbor.
