CANADA'S BARGAIN WITH THE UNITED STATES THE TERMS OF THE WATERWAYS TREATY

Canada Gets 36,000 Cubic Feet Per Second at Niagara Falls.

STATES GETS 20,000 CUBIC FEET

International Joint Commission to Deal With All Canadian-American Differences.

The text of the waterways treaty between United States and Great Britain has been made public. The agreement was negotiated on behalf of Canada by the Canadian section of the waterways commission, headed by Mr. George C. Gibbons, K. C., of London. The document is not long, and should be read by every Canadian who pretends to take an interest in public affairs. The full text is as follows:

The United States of America and His Majesty the King of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and of the British Dominions beyond the Seas, Emperor of India, being equally desirous to prevent disputes regarding the use of boundary waters and to settle all questions which are now pending between the United States and the Dominion of Canada, involving the rights, obligations, or interests of either in relation to the other or to the inhabitants of the other, along their common frontier, and to make provision for the adjustment and settlement of all such questions as may hereafter arise, have resolved to conclude a treaty in furtherance of these ends, and for that purpose have appointed as their respective plenipotentiaries:

The President of the United States of America, Elihu Root, Secretary of State of the United States; and His Britannic Majesty, the Right Honourable James Bryce, O. M., his ambassador extraordinary and plenipotentiary at Washington.

Who, after having communicated to one another their full powers, found in good and due form, have agreed upon the following articles:



THE ROYAL CHAPEL AT HOLYROOD PALACE.

Under the tracery window of the nave stood the high altar, before whose steps many a king has knelt in penitence, and many a queen has bowed in love. In its roseate light James II. was crowned, and the poor shattered body of James IV. was brought from Flodden Field, to lie beneath its shadows. Here the young Queen Mary and the ill-fated Darnley were married, and here the "Merry Monarch," Charles I., was crowned with regal splendor a king of Scotland, while Cromwell's "Ironside" have stood before it, unabashed, with torches in their hands.

6,000 DIE IN PERSIAN QUAKE

Sixty Villages Wiped Out in the Province of Luristan.

Teheran, Persia, Feb. 17.—News was received here today showing that the violent earthquake recorded on Jan. 13, on almost every scientific observatory in the world, had its location in the Province of Luristan, Western Persia. Sixty villages in that district were wholly or partially destroyed, and the result in loss of life is placed at between 5,000 and 6,000 people.

A SEQUEL TO THE SMALLPOX CHARGES

Hotel Proprietor Takes Umbrage at Remarks of an Alderman.

It appears that Mr. Arthur E. Brenner, proprietor of the City Hotel, has taken offence at certain remarks which Ald. Stevenson is alleged to have made at the council meeting on Monday night, in which the doctor was credited with saying that there had been a case of smallpox in that hotel. The doctor says that he said "in a city hotel," not "in the City Hotel," and hence the error. As a matter of fact, the case of smallpox referred to occurred years ago, since which time nearly every hotel in London has changed hands. In The Advertiser's account of the doctor's speech he is quoted as referring only to a case in "a local hotel."

Mr. Brenner has threatened the doctor with a writ for damages, but the matter will likely be dropped now, since it has been explained.

PORTO RICO SHAKEN

Heavy Earthquakes Felt Throughout the Island This Morning.

San Juan, Porto Rico, Feb. 17.—Heavy earthquake shocks were felt throughout the island of Porto Rico at 3 o'clock this morning. The inhabitants were awakened by the oscillations, and their alarm was great. No damage, however, was done. The vibrations lasted for at least twenty seconds, and the movement was from east to west. The weather today is very stormy.

ENTOMBED MINERS BROUGHT TO SURFACE

Thirty-two Found Severely Injured but Alive at Newcastle.

Newcastle, Feb. 17.—After rescue work had progressed in the shaft of the colliery at West Stanley, a small mining town, near here, where a disastrous explosion occurred yesterday, entombing nearly 200 men, the mine was cleared as far as the second level, where 32 men were found alive. Most of them were severely injured.

TRAVELLERS WILL LIKELY WIN FIGHT

For a Change in the Date of the Municipal Elections.

The commercial travellers of the city are greatly in favor of changing the date of holding the municipal elections from the first Monday in January to New Year's Day.

Last year a petition was presented to the council asking that the Legislature be petitioned to make the change.

This request was presented to the Ontario House, but that body did not view the petition favorably, and nothing was done.

Ald. Ferguson is especially in favor of the change, and thinks that by persistent effort, the desired result may be achieved.

"London is one of the most important wholesale centres in Canada," he said. "A very large number of travellers go out of this city. They travel all over Canada. They form opinions and could give expression of their knowledge through the ballot box. They are prevented from so doing by the fact that they have to be out of London during the elections. It is not fair to them. I think the Government will look with favor on our request, as it is not unreasonable. It will make for the good of the city and the Government should, I think, assist us that much."

NEW SEPARATE SCHOOL IN LONDON

Board Contemplates the Erection of Two Very Shortly.

The Catholic board of education will erect two new schools in the near future, one of which will be located in the southeastern section of the city, and the other probably on Maitland street north.

The matter will come up for discussion at the next meeting of the board, which will be held on Monday, March 1, or possibly at the next regular meeting on April 5.

The present schools in the northern and eastern sections of the city are greatly overcrowded. There is but one separate school in East London, that being St. Mary's, a four-roomed building on Lyle street.

The north end has also but one school, St. Nicholas, on Cheapside street, composed of two rooms. It is thought that better accommodation is necessary, and buildings worth about \$5,000 will be erected in each section.

Within the past couple of years two new schools have been added, St. Martin's, on Duchess avenue, in South London, and St. John's, on Hill street, near Maitland. Both schools have two rooms.

One new room has also been opened in St. Mary's school this year.

HEALTH BOARD ARE NOW AWAKE

Addition to Smallpox Hospital Is Proposed.

ARCHITECT IS TO PREPARE PLANS

Telephone Is To Be Placed in the Building at Once—Asking for Charity.

Architect Nutter has received instructions from the board of health to prepare plans at once for enlarging the smallpox hospital. The plans call for three more bedrooms, which, when completed, will give a capacity of six bedrooms at the hospital.

The ventilator, through which it was claimed snow blew in, has been fixed. The medical health officer has received instructions to have a telephone installed as quickly as possible, and last, but not least, the tomato can, which served as a spoonholder for the patients, has been replaced by a glass.

Charity Is Suggested.

The board wish that any person having an old dining-room table to spare or an old sofa would donate it to the hospital, as the present table is too small and the sofa is worn out.

If anyone having these articles to spare will telephone Inspector McCullum the articles will be sent for and taken away.

Toronto, Ont., Feb. 17.—Rev. B. H. Staffer, pastor of the Bond Street Congregational Church, is defendant in an action for damages brought by Mark and Annie Maynard, of Pope avenue. Mr. Staffer is accused of being the originator of the story that the house was haunted, resulting in the place being overrun by a crowd of curiosity hunters, who tramped down vines and destroyed flowers.

INDEPENDENTS ARE STILL LOOKING HERE

Anxious to Compete With the Bell Telephone Company.

No word has been received from either the Bell Telephone Company nor the Independent Telephone Company, regarding the franchise.

The present franchise has ten months to go yet, so both companies still have plenty of time to prepare their offers. There is no doubt the Independents will make an attempt to come into London.

A gentleman in close touch with them when the last negotiations were being carried on, stated to The Advertiser that while he had no definite word from them, he was confident that the Independents would make another attempt to get into London.

It is not thought likely that the Bell's bonus of \$4,000 per annum will be increased; in fact, it was stated that the company would not pay anything for the franchise.

Under an order of the Dominion railway commission all lines may be attached to the Bell Company's lines, thus making practically one large company, with the commission controlling the rates.

This, it was stated, would do away with the necessity or advisability of another trunk line, and would confine the operations of the Independents to building rural lines, to be later attached to the Bell Company.

"I have heard nothing," said Mayor Stevely. "I was informed that the Bell Company had refused to pay the corporation of West Toronto a bonus for an exclusive franchise. Whether or not they will do the same here is not known as yet. We will know shortly."

SUICIDE FAD IN ST. PETERSBURG

Nerve-Shattered Society Folk Seek Death in Many Ways.

London, Feb. 17.—The Daily Mail St. Petersburg correspondent declares that neurasthenia is claiming an ever-increasing number of victims in all sections of St. Petersburg society. A surprising number of people, tired of life, seek death by various methods. Persons of fashionable society journey to Finland and fling themselves into the romantic Matra rapids. Strange clubs and societies are in existence. One of these is styled "Tiger and Hunter." Two members draw lots to decide who will be the tiger and who the hunter. A silver bell is hung around the tiger's neck, and then the hunter is given a loaded revolver. Both enter a large darkened room, and the spectators take refuge in safe corners. The hunt begins. The hunters are bound; he is allowed six shots, guided by the sound of the bell. If he fails to hit the tiger the role is reversed, and the hunter becomes the tiger. This continues until blood flows. Another society has "Champagne Evenings," where one among twenty bottles is filled with morphine. Sometimes in a single night there are numerous secret suicides, for which there is no plausible explanation, giving rise, says the correspondent, to the suspicion that the victims belong to the same league of self-destruction.

COMPANY WILL MEET THE CITY

In Regard to the Proposed North End Extension.

The question of the North End extension is now a live one, and will be taken up seriously during the next week.

When the council meets again, there will probably be a report made on the subject.

Mayor Stevely had a conference with Mr. T. H. Smallman, vice-president of the company, regarding it, and it was decided to take the matter up before the next meeting of the council.

A special meeting of No. 1 committee will likely be called, and the proposed extension will be gone into thoroughly.

"I had a conference with Mr. Smallman regarding the North End extension," said Mayor Stevely, "and he told me the company were ready to meet the city, and talk the question over. We will arrange a meeting as soon as possible so that the matter can be disposed of at the next session of the council, if possible."

A Nice Question.

As stated in The Advertiser some time ago, the company will insist on the removal of the Wellington street line to Richmond street, and then if they do not a belt will be constructed up William street to Cheapside, up Cheapside to Colborne, and down Colborne to Oxford.

COUNCIL MAY AGREE.

So far as can be learned, the city council will agree to this, as a number of the aldermen are of the opinion that a better service would result from the change.

Manager King stated that it would be considerably easier for the company to operate the line straight up Richmond than make the turns, as at present.
