

THE NAW MAGISTRATE.

HIS WORSHIP THE MAYOR informed the Council that the Government, with whom rested the selection of a police magistrate, under recent legislation, were in favor of appointing Hon. A. N. Richards to the position, which, however, he would not accept at a salary of less that \$250 per month. The Attorney-General had requested a reply if the appointment was satisfactory to the Council; of course, the Government could fix the salary as well as make the appointment. The reference to the Board was merely a courtesy.

ALD, MUNN did not want any such courtesies from the Government, after they had taken from the Government after they had taken from the city the power to appoint its own officials. 
