Soon after this a courh appears, accompanied by an expectoration of thick mucous, followed by a hectic fush, loss of flesh and strength, and night sweats continue, when the patient assumes all the appearance of having a genuine case of consumption. But this is simply catarrh of the ungs, or chronic bronchitis.

ungs, or chronic bronchitis.

In the later stages of the disease the mucous membrane of the larger bronchial tube softens, while in the smaller tubes and air-cells of the lungs the mucous membrane becomes congested and inflamed. There are no cavities nor tubercles in the lungs, but merely a wasting away of the larger bronchial tubes, and death takes place from obstruction of the bronchial tubes and air-cells of the lungs. The patient dies from exhaustion and suffocation, being unable to expectorate the mucous which accumulates in the passage leading to the lungs, which in some cases is sticky and small in quantity, but more commonly copious, of a light straw or yellowish green. Oftentimes streaks of blood make their appearance in the mucous, and at times there is a disagreeable smell. Persons thus afflieded are very liable to take a cold, at which time the mucous becomes clear and frothy, and it is not uncommonly the case that the patient dies in one of these attacks.
