At the non-jury sittings this morning Chief Justice Armour gave judgmen in Farwell v. Jamieson.

The defendant Philip Jamieson, the clothier of Toronto, leased in 1888 the premises known as 221 Queen-street east to one Armstrong for 21 years. Armstrong, with Jamieson's consent, subsequently assigned the lease by way of mortgage to the London & Canadian Loan & Agency Company, and the defendant says that their mort-gage becoming in arrear the company took possession, and by their agent Parsons rented the premises to the plaintiff. At all events, defendant says that the rent being in arrear, he distrained, and finding the plaintiffs, as he asserts, in actual occupation of the premises, seized four planes and the premises, seized four planos and three organs and stools belonging to three organs and stools belonging to them, and, despite their warning to the contrary, sold the goods and applied the proceeds on his claim for rent. The plaintiffs are Farwell & Glendon, piano dealers, and they say that Parsons gave them leave to store pianos on the premises for \$5 a month, and they bring this action to recover \$2000 damages for trespass. The question is whether the plaintiffs were tenants within the meaning of R.S.O., ch. 143, sec. 28, sub-sec. 3, which is as follows: "The word 'tenant' in this section shall extend to and include the subtenant and the assigns of the tenant and any person in actual occupation of the premises under or with the assent of the tenant, during the currency."
