Table 2 illustrates the major exporting countries supplying the U.S. importers surveyed, the number of respondents supplied by each country and the overall level of satisfaction of the importers for their suppliers. A fuller presentation of these results for all countries supplying products to the respondents is provided in Appendix 8.

Overall, while most respondents were reasonably satisfied with their suppliers, cases of dissatisfaction were noted in 5 of 64 supplier-buyer relationships reported.<sup>2</sup> Reasons for dissatisfaction included delivery delays and quality problems. Four of the five instances of dissatisfaction occurred with suppliers from Asian countries. The fifth case, relating to a lack of technical support, concerned a supplier from Canada. Common reasons given for importing telecommunications equipment and the frequency of response are as follows:
