I must also advise the house that quite some considerable time ago I asked my department to review the whole policy with respect to draft resisters and military deserters seeking entrance to Canada either overseas or at border points, and with respect to deserters already in Canada who seek admission as immigrants. That review is nearing completion and then this whole matter will be considered carefully. It is a very complicated and difficult matter and undoubtedly has attracted a great deal of interest because of its complexity.

P.E.I.—PHASING OUT OF EXPERIMENTAL FUR FARM
