Questions

Canada are collected by Statistics Canada (Dominion Bureau of Statistics) and are included in published data relating to the totals of Canada's International Investment Position. Separate data for Japan have not been shown in the publications up to now as the amounts were relatively small and concentrated in only a few companies. With the increased role played by this investment the next publication dealing with Canada's International Investment Position will, however, show the book value of Japanese direct investment in Canada as a separate breakdown. At the end of 1967 the book value of this investment amounted to \$34 million.
