Dear Mr. Macpherson:

I have your letter about Sir Arthur Salter. When Lord Irwin inaugurated the Massey Lecture in Toronto last April he declined the invitations from the Canadian Club and the Empire Club here on the ground that the lecturer should make no public address in the city in which the lecture itself is given. I think you will appreciate the reasons for this. It is obviously important not to impair the significance of the lecture which is the object of the speaker's visit. I think we must adhere to the same policy with regard to the second lecture in Montreal and arrange that the lecture at McGill University should be Salter's only public address in the city. I know you will understand this arrangement.
