Many of these graduates now occupy high positions covering a wide field of activity. Throughout the Dominion, in Government service, in the executive and operating departments of the largest public utilities and manufacturing and construction industries, in mining and smelting, on the research staffs of the National Research Council and of industrial concerns, and on the teaching staffs of the universities, McGill graduates occupy leading positions and touch the national life of the Dominion at many points.

McGill's faculty of applied science, now known as the faculty of engineering, can justly claim that its graduates are playing an important part in the development of the resources of the Dominion.
