

THE SENATE OF CANADA

BILL K<sup>6</sup>.

An Act for the relief of Ethel Margaret Tweddell Cartmel.

Preamble.

WHEREAS Ethel Margaret Tweddell Cartmel, residing  
at the city of Montreal, in the province of Quebec,  
teacher, wife of George Bliss Cartmel, who is domiciled in  
Canada and residing at the said city, has by her petition  
alleged that they were married on the sixth day of May, 5  
A.D. 1939, at the village of Valcartier, in the said province,  
she then being Ethel Margaret Tweddell, a spinster; and  
whereas by her petition she has prayed that, because of  
his adultery since then, their marriage be dissolved; and  
whereas the said marriage and adultery have been proved 10  
by evidence adduced and it is expedient that the prayer of  
her petition be granted: Therefore His Majesty, by and  
with the advice and consent of the Senate and House of  
Commons of Canada, enacts as follows:—

Marriage  
dissolved.

1. The said marriage between Ethel Margaret Tweddell 15  
and George Bliss Cartmel, her husband, is hereby dissolved,  
and shall be henceforth null and void to all intents and  
purposes whatsoever.

Right to  
marry again.

2. The said Ethel Margaret Tweddell may at any time 20  
hereafter marry any man whom she might lawfully marry  
if the said marriage with the said George Bliss Cartmel  
had not been solemnized.
