viscus, eris, n. (mostly in pl.) *the inwards; the viscera.*

vī-ta, æ, f. (for **viv-ta**, fr. **viv-o**) *Life.*

vitium, ii, n. *Fault, blemish, error, crime, vice.*

vīto (1), a. *To shun, avoid.*

vivo (3), **vixi**, **victum**, n. *To live.*

vīv-us, a, um, adj. (**vīv-o**) *Alive.*

vix, adv. *With difficulty, hardly, scarcely; vixdum, scarcely.*

voco (1), a. *To call; summon.*

volner-o (1), a. (**volnus**) *To wound.*
