Washington, Nov. 26.—Arrangements were completed today between the Canadian Warmission in Washington, and the central fuel committee of the United States, under which there will be an allotment of bituminous coal to Canada to meet emergency requirements. The procedure in securing supplies will be as follows:

General Average Was From 100 to 150 Per Cent. on Invested Capital.

Washington, Nov. 26.-Bituminous coal mines east of the Mississippi River in 1917 made "what might be termed fabulous profits," the general average being from 100 to 150 per cent. on invested capital, according to a statement issued tonight by Secretary Glass, based on data furnished by experts of the international rev-
