BIG C. P. R. LAND SYNDICATE.

Has Been Formed in London—Mr. Preston's Escape.

(Canadian Associated Press Cable.)
London, Oct. 6.—The Canadian Associated Press understands a big London syndicate has been formed to retain Canadian Pacific land. It is stated to have bought 90,000 acres of C.P.R. land at Edmonton. The shares in this syndicate are stated to be already largely over-subscribed and could not be obtained for money by influential buyers in the city on Wednesday evening.

BRITAIN AND RUSSIA NOW TO FORM CLOSE ALLIANCE

No Reason Why Ancient Enemies
Should Not Come to Understand-
ing Ensuring Peace.

London, Oct. 6.—Following closely upon the publication of the text of the Anglo-Japanese treaty has come considerable talk of the possibility of an understanding between Great Britain and Russia. All the newspapers are devoting columns to the discussion of the question, pointing out that if Russia is sincere in her expressions of a desire for peace in Central Asia, there is no reason why the two ancient enemies should not come to an agreement that will not only assure peace, but clear away the suspicious leading to friction which have existed for years. That negotiations with this object in view are pending seems possible, the definite official confirmation is lacking.

In the event of the rumors that have been floating about by the recent frequent visits paid to the foreign office by the Russian ambassador, M. Benckendorff, who returned from his return from his holidays a fortnight ago and the fact that Foreign Secretary Lansdowne, who returned from his vacation to publish the text of the Anglo-Japanese treaty, has not resumed it.

Count Benckendorff, the Russian ambassador, had a long interview with Lord Lansdowne at the foreign office yesterday and the latter left London immediately afterwards for Balmoral, where Premier Balfour is present as minister in attendance on King Edward.

Of course the visits of the Russian ambassador to the foreign office have been connected with Emperor Nicholas' invitation to Great Britain to participate in the second peace conference at The Hague, but Great Britain has already answered his majesty's preliminary invitation. It is thought here that the present is an opportune moment for reaching a better understanding between the two countries, both the British and Russian papers having strongly advocated it for the past week. The position of the British government was clearly stated in a speech delivered by Gerald Balfour, president of the local government board, yesterday, in which he said:

"Great Britain has no intention of making aggressive movements in Central Asia. Our object is defence, not offence, and if the Russian government desires to come to an understanding with us in that part of the world, it will not find the British government backward in readiness to consider any proposal which it might desire to put forward."

The newspaper discussion has reached a much wider range and includes suggestions for agreements which, if carried out, would make Europe a family in which there would be no differences.

ALLAN'S NEW TURBINES

DELICATE SURGICAL OPERATION.

Successfully Provides Artificial Intestine.

In an endeavor to prolong the life of George Todd, an aged tobaccoist, Dr. Oldright operated upon him Thursday at St. Michael's Hospital. He achieved the most important feat of changing the course of the faeces. The refuse of digestion will in future come out at a point opposite the lower end of the stomach.

The patient had but a month to live. The cancerous growth was fast increasing. The trouble could not be placed with any degree of accuracy without the abdomen being opened. This was done by the surgeon. It was discovered that the growth was placed near the lower end of the bowels. This could not be removed from the stomach. The patient would die within the time limit of two hours and a half set for children's treatment.

The operation was watched with a great deal of interest by the medical student body, as it is a very exceptional operation. Todd was reported to be progressing finely and the recovery of his life is thought that by the operation performed, which is one of very few in the knowledge of medical men, Todd's life will be prolonged at least a year.

Bristol docks are being brought to the notice of Canadian and American shippers by A. Harvey, assistant general manager of the Bristol, Avonmouth and Portsmouth docks, who was talking to Secretary Morley of the board of trade when the World met him yesterday afternoon.

The receivers of Bristol own the docks. They took them over twenty years ago and have found them a paying project, so much so that there is now in course of construction a new dock to cost \$15,000,000 at the mouth of the Avon.

It is pointed out by Mr. Harvey that Bristol Channel is the safest in England, and the present Avonmouth dock, which was constructed in 1877, is most thoroughly equipped. The old docks at Bristol, right up the River Avon, were constructed in 1805. The new dock will be ready for business in about a year from now.
