Caesar, who had been drinking, threatened to shoot four officers and burn up the town. Shortly after a barn and a house were discovered on fire, and the sheriff, with ex-District-Attorney Seabal, went in search of Caesar. The latter had run home and had armed himself with a shot gun. As the sheriff entered the house Caesar shot the officer through the forehead, Farley dying soon afterwards.
