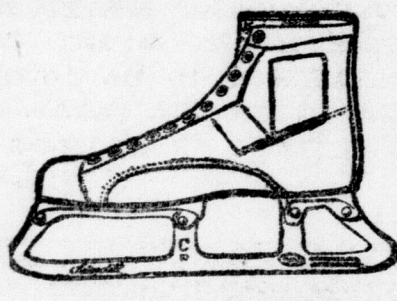
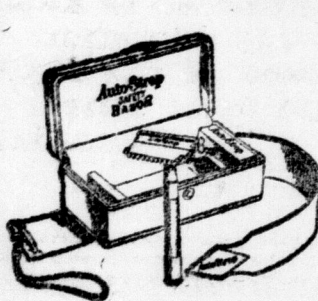


CROWN ATTORNEY WILL

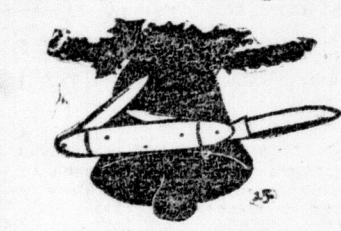

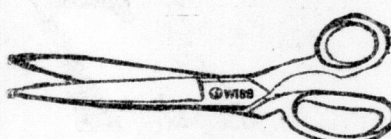

THINKS COLORED TROOPS

OKLAHOMA CITY, Okla., Dec. 4.—Governor Robertson today cancelled his request for troops to protect mine properties, when he learned that two companies of negro infantrymen were to be sent to the state from Columbia, N.M. In a message to Major-General Dickman, commander of the southern division of the army at San Antonio, Texas, Governor Robertson declared these troops would only "involve us in unnecessary conflict and confusion."

IN COLD SNAPWestern Ontario Reports
Show Shortage At Some
Points.

BORDER SITUATION ACUTE

Windsor Gas Supply Flicker-
ing—Zero Weather Feared
—Coal Pile Sinks.

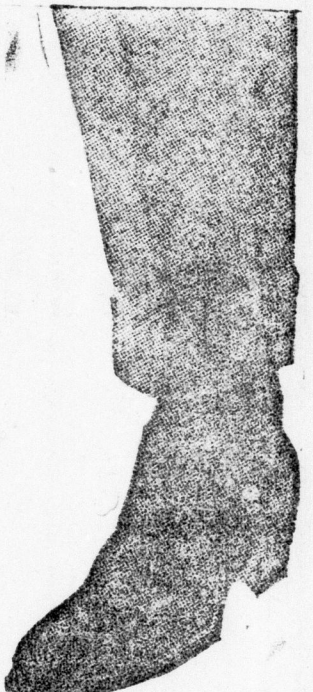

cities is indeed bad, although the pro-
ducing company is doing everything
possible to augment our supply. The
long drag on the fields for the past two
weeks of cold weather is the cause, and
I shudder to think what it will be like
when we reach zero weather.

The municipal coal pile is sinking fast,
and already more than half of it is
gone. Extra teams are working every-
time to get it to the people who have
found that the gas they were depend-
ing upon practically has failed them.

Local Fuel Controller Robert Parker is
showing preference to homes, where
there are little children.

Schools, churches and public build-
ings have sufficient coal to carry them
through unless the winter is particularly
severe.

Telegraphing from Toronto to the
Ford Motor Company today, Fuel Con-
troller Harrington asked that, in view
of the impending fuel shortage through-
out the province, the motor company
assign its surplus coal supply to the
Government for distribution to relieve
the existing stringency. An inventory
of the supply was at once ordered, and
it is probable the Ford officials will
assist the Government to the fullest
extent in the present crisis.

BRANTFORD GAS SHORT.
BRANTFORD, Dec. 4.—Hundreds of
users of natural gas are throwing out
their gas stoves and going back to
coal, following the experiences of the
last few days. Predictions as to the
situation are gloomy.

Tilbury natural gas supply being ex-
hausted in December are born out by
the low pressure now.

CHATHAM HAS LITTLE.
CHATHAM, Dec. 4.—Local coal
dealers today stated that there are
approximately 900 tons of coal in the
city which is barely enough to fill pre-
sent orders on file. The cold snap of
the past few days and consequent
serious reduction in pressure of natural
gas has made it scarcer. The dealers
complain that when the appeal was
made during the summer to order coal
it was practically ignored.

KITCHENER WELL OFF.
KITCHENER, Dec. 4.—Except in the
case of the light commission which
operates the gas plant, the soft coal
situation in this city is not as critical
as it appears to be in other centres.
The commission has a supply of fuel
on hand for about four weeks, with no
more in sight at present, but the
assurance of the jobbers that sufficient
coal will be supplied to keep the gas
plant in operation. Other public build-
ings are well supplied.

A canvass among the industries of
the city elicited the information that
practically every one has a plentiful
supply to keep the plants going for
several months.

KINGSTON'S SITUATION

FAIRLY SATISFACTORY

KINGSTON, Dec. 4.—The coal situa-
tion in Kingston is regarded as fairly
satisfactory. Provided consumers ex-
ercise economy it is thought that the
supply of anthracite coal will put this

city pretty well through the winter.
The supply of soft coal is sufficient
to meet the demand for some time.
It is felt that by carefully husband-
ing the supplies the public utilities will
have enough to last. The hospitals
are looking to the dealers to see them
through, as the supply seems equal
to the demand. The various industries
have enough on hand to last for some
time.

HAMILTON MAY HAVE TO
DEPEND ON HARD WOOD

HAMILTON, Dec. 4.—Hamilton is

facing the most acute coal famine in
city history, according to a statement
made this morning by S. H. Kent, city
clerk and local fuel administrator.
Many concerns are beginning to run
short of bituminous coal, and in many
cases they are already on a ration
basis. The city is arranging to meet
the situation by supplying hardwood to
those institutions and concerns needing
assistance. Fortunately the city owns
four thousand cords of hardwood located
here and at Algonquin Park, and this
is being thrown on the market. This
wood was purchased in 1917, when Ham-
ilton suffered so severely from a lack
of fuel. Already some plants are heat-
ing their buildings by hardwood in-
stead of coal.

COMMONS TO DISCUSS

ARREST OF CHAPLAIN

LONDON, Dec. 4.—Joseph Devlin,
Irish Nationalist, secured the passage
of a motion for the adjournment of the
House of Commons today for a discus-
sion of the arrest in Ireland of Father
O'Donnell, an Australian chaplain, on a
charge of using traitorous and dis-
loyal language. Father O'Donnell was
acquitted of the charge by a court-
martial before which he was tried.
Mr. Devlin's resolution declared "the
intolerable outrage against Father
O'Donnell calls for immediate reproba-
tion by the House and the dismissal of
the officials responsible."

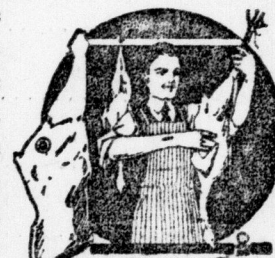
