Foreign Crop Summary. J. P. Bickell & Co. furnish the following Broomhall weekly crop summary: United Kingdom—Weather during the past week has shown some improvement, it having been drier, which has enabled plowing to be carried on.

Argentina—The outlook for the growing crop continues to be favorable. There are some private estimates given out which forecast an exportable surplus of 120,000,000 bushels, and 120,000,000 bushels, our agents preliminary view for 1910,000,000 bushels.

Australia—Crops are generally good, but the crop outlook is not so bright as it was a few weeks ago. The wheat crop is fair, but the corn crop is not so good. The sugar crop is also not so good.

Government Report Supplement. WASHINGTON, Nov. 9.—Supplemental to the report issued yesterday, giving the estimated conditions and prospects for the year 1909 of corn and other crops, the bureau of statistics of the United States Agricultural Department today issued preliminary estimates of the production of the crops named, as follows:

Wheat—Wheat, 4,320,000 bushels; spring wheat, 2,180,000 bushels; oats, 3,935,000 bushels; barley, 1,915,000 bushels; rye, 2,065,000 bushels.
