Speculating in Veterans Grants is Warmly Condemned in Legislature. COUNTRY UP IN ARMS

In the legislature yesterday Captain Ainsley (Tonkiss) made a good case out of his bill to amend the veterans' land grant act.

Where the inspector reports that any such lands are owned by persons living outside the district in which the lands are situated, or by persons other than the original locators or grantees, the minister may cause a valuation to be made of such lands by some person to be appointed by him, and may fix the price to be placed upon such lands having regard to the facilities of the lands and the timber thereon and the value of the farming lands in the same neighborhood.
