

hearted churchmen of that mission. Their attachment to their Church amid great difficulties is worthy of encouragement. Were their means proportionate to their will they would not ask assistance but grant it to others. They are now making an effort to build a parsonage, which will tend to secure the permanent residence of a clergyman among them.

The Executive Committee have also paid during 1861 for Books, as part of reserved fourth, to Lunenburg, \$4; and Yarmouth, \$8. To meet the expenses of the preacher of the Annual Sermon before the Society, \$20; for printing the twenty-third Report, \$170; for the use of the Temperance Hall in 1860 and 1861, \$28; Secretary's salary, \$120; and for other incidental expenses, \$41.28. * The sum of \$400, which had been voted for the support of missionaries, but not used in consequence of vacancies, the Executive Committee have thought good to reserve for that purpose. These payments left a balance in the hands of the Treasurer at the close of 1861 of \$1514.38. From this balance should be deducted, grants to missionaries not called for at the end of the year, \$717;* unpaid grants to churches, \$55; contributions through the D. C. S. for the benefit of the heathen, and sent during 1862 to the S. P. G., \$91.50; leaving a balance of \$250.88.

In concluding this account of the business entrusted to their care, the Executive Committee express their humble and hearty thanks to Almighty God, for the protection and support which he has given, and for the blessing which has attended their labors; and
