seriously jeopardizes these important educational interests, and threatens to bring all efforts in this direction to a speedy termination. The situation is, therefore, one which demands upon the ficient relief, and calls for definite action with a view to placing the Garden upon such a stable basis of efficient work as will guarantee its permanence and a continuation and development of the work already commenced.

Our relations to kindred institutions continue on the same friendly basis as in former years, and many exchanges are annually effected.
