It is well for the farmer to be looking ahead, and securing such seeds as he is intending to plant or sow the coming season. Fences must be looked to this month, as animals are apt, unless cared for, to be strolling about the fields, and will do much mischief on newly seeded grass lands, and nearly destroy such wheat fields as they can obtain access to.
