COYOTES AND JACK RABBITS

Hundreds of Men Form Party to Drive Them Over "Hell's Acre."

Spokane, Wash., Oct. 13.—Ranchers in Douglas County, Wash., have organized for a coyote and jack-rabbit drive over the country known as Hell's Half Acre at the mouth of Cuddy's canon to be pulled off the second week in November.

The committee in charge is composed of A. P. Kiser, M. Clark and Isaac Simmons, for the ranchers on Badger mountain, and R. T. Woodruff, Percy Scheble and Oscar Tetherow for the residents of Wenatchee.

Coyotes are thick in the mountain, and jack-rabbits are also numerous. Shotgun will be used solely, the committee having decided to bar rifles. It is expected several hundred men will participate in the drive.
