From the conditional promises made to the Secretary, the Committee feel confident this balance will shortly be paid in, and the fund be made a allable before the close of the present year for the objects and designs set forth in the prospectus and adopted by the Society in 1860.

The Committee desire to call the earnest attention of their fellow Churchmen to the fact that while the Fund could not go into operation until \$80,000 was paid into the hands of the Treasurer, yet it was originally proposed to raise double the amount, and that a continuous effort should be made by those who desire the welfare and independence of their clergymen, to accomplish this desirable object, and the Committee hope that all will contribute liberally to increase the Church Endowment Fund.

The Committee feel sensibly the loss of their late Chairman, Mr. Almon, who always evinced a warm interest in every object connected with the well-being of the Church, and the promotion of the comfort and usefulness of its Ministry.

Our late Secretary, Mr. Frederick Allison, having resigned, Mr. W. C. Silver was unanimously chosen as his successor. The Committee have much pleasure in bearing testimony to the energy and zeal manifested by Mr. Allison in the discharge of the duties of his office, whereby the completion of the Fund was greatly aided, and feel confident that with the well known interest which Mr. Silver has shown in all matters in which the Church and its progress are interwoven, this Fund must necessarily increase.

The death of Mr. Almon, the resignation of Mr. Graham, and the appointment of Mr. Silver to the office of Secretary, cause three vacancies on the Committee. The Rule fixes the number of the Committee at fifteen, but by some mistake it has been composed of sixteen; consequently there are only two places to be filled up.
