AN APPEAL FOR THE BLIND.

To the Editor of The Times:
Sir—There are probably few men who have had the privilege of writing your much respected paper on the different subjects of the day, who feel as backward as I. But I am a firm believer that there comes to all, both young and old, rich and poor, certain duties which he or she must fulfill in later life they will have many regrets. So I, a humble citizen of this city, make bold to bring before you the subject of the School for the Blind, situated in Halifax, N. S.

This school, as you must know, is not for Nova Scotia people any more than any of the Maritime Province people, and I as the father of a little blind girl cannot help but see the difference between the School for the Blind, situated in Halifax, N. S. This school is badly in need of our financial support as a city more than ever it has in the past. It might be if other cities in the Maritime Provinces showed as much indifference as this city, the school would have to close its doors. This might easily be explained. When I say on account of the school being situated in Halifax, it does not interest the people of St. John; but when you consider there are twelve or fourteen children from this city alone, outside of many others from your province, you can't help but see the need of your support.

The people of this city are quite quick to respond to the different calls for money when it comes in the line of sports, such as playgrounds for the children, ball grounds for the baseball fans, rowing contests for ones interested in this line of sport, and the demands for the different funds such as the Red Cross, the milk fund and many others. I would not infer that these are not all right and proper, but why not when the time comes (which will be soon) show the people of the Maritime Provinces that although we enjoy sports in St. John, and are quite willing to promote them, yet we are not forgetting one of the most important things in life, such as educating the blind, making life worth living for those who otherwise would wish they never were born; making useful citizens of those who would be helpless if we did not have this wonderful school supervised by a smart and intelligent man, E. Chesley Allen founded by a man that the King saw to honour for his so doing. Yet I am afraid this city shows less interest than any other city throughout our province.

In closing allow me to state that regardless of how much money a man might possess, that if Sir Frederick Fraser and other noted men had not founded these schools for the blind, all the money that one might possess would not educate those that are sightless.

If the citizens of this city could only visit this school in Halifax they could not help but be impressed by the way the students are educated and cared for while receiving their education.
