

ENGLISH PHEASANT

Defining the policy of the Ontario Government as one which seeks to conserve as fully as possible the fur and game resources of the province, Hon. Charles McCrea, Minister of Mines, gave to the Toronto Field Naturalists' Club, on a recent evening, a complete picture of the functioning of the Provincial Department of Game and Fisheries.

Dealing with game preserves, Hon.

Mr. McCrea announced that during the last month a new preserve of some 800 square miles had been created, bringing the total area of crown game preserves in the province up to 3,271,040 acres. The newest preserve, known as the Superior, was located between the City of Port Arthur and the Village of Schreiber, lying to the south of the main line of the Canadian Pacific Railway.

In general, the minister's address was of an entirely informative character, statistics playing a major role. The province was divided into six districts, he explained, with headquarters at London, Ottawa, Orillia, North Bay, Fort William and Patricia. Aside from the executive staff, there were some 107 employees, wardens, and so forth, under the department. For the fiscal year of 1923 revenues of the department amounted to \$621,148, while expenditures had been \$391,422, showing a surplus of \$229,725.
