#### INTERESTED IN SONGS OF WALES

Lloyd George Gives Notable Address at Concert.

London, Sept. 28.—(By Mail)—Lloyd George presided recently at a concert at Llanystudydd, the village near Ortel, where he received his early schooling. He listened with great interest to a number of Welsh songs and recitations, and afterwards gave an address.

Alluding to the village institute, where the concert was held, he said it was a great change from the time when he was a boy there.

They occasionally had a penny reading in the village school, and the only institute they had was the village institute, where they settled every question under the sun.

He recalled how on one occasion his finger was caught in a cog wheel, and he had the marks ever since.

There was a good deal of talk about the way in which there was a drift from the villages to the towns; it was one of the social dangers of Britain. The more he thought about it the more anxious he was about it.

Make Life Attractive.

After all, a country was based on its soil. Of all the countries engaged in the war, we had the smallest proportion of people whose life was associated with the soil, and for that reason we had the largest percentage of rejections for physical unfitness.

He could see the proportion of the industrial population becoming overwhelming, and the calm, quiet life of the soil vanishing. It was a real peril to England.

You must create something that makes life attractive. The church and the chapel have done their best, but they cannot do everything, and institutions of this kind will have a great effect in keeping the young people and making it worth their while to contribute to the life of the country.

There were the fascinations of the cities and unless the villages could compete they would not retain their people.

Where a country was a depopulated wilderness it was a doomed land. By their institute they were doing something to restore the balance which was essential to the life, strength, and power of the land.

Temple Stones of Empire.

Mr. Lloyd George went on to speak of the Welsh language and tradition, and on literature, he said, the Empire would not be nearly so rich as it was. There were people who once thought they should cease to be Welsh—who said that was the only way to make the people useful. They were wrong. "We have fought better for the Empire as good Welshmen than we would have done as bad Englishmen," he declared amid cheers. "It is no good thing taking a Highlander out of his hills. This Empire is a temple of many stones. Far distant lands all contribute, and all its localities are polished. That is its beauty; that is its strength."

"I want the granite of Wales to be there, but I don't want it painted to look like Aberdeen granite."

Songs of His Boyhood.

"Polish it if you will, but let the color be the local one. The Empire will be stronger; Wales will be better." He continued, "For God's sake go on singing your songs, delivering your recitations. I heard them when I was a lad. I hope to hear them until I die, and I hope you will sing them over my grave. Keep to the songs of Wales. That is how you will make your contribution to the Empire and to humanity."
