Paris, April 27.—(By mail.)—The after-war orgy of pleasure in cosmopolitan centres has developed so much daring license in Paris that the minister of justice has taken the matter in hand and called a sharp halt to the gradual shrinkage in the amount of dress worn on the stage and continual increase in looseness of speech.

Everything approaching obscenity must be cut out of stage representations, he declares, and dramatic artists and music hall singers must be clad. Otherwise, the artists and the directors responsible for the character of the attractions offered to the public will be prose-The press praises the minister for his courage and proposes a general movement in favor of the uplifting of dramatic productions.
