

DR. G. F. PENTECOST, EVANGELIST, DEAD

Was Associated With Dwight L. Moody for a Number of Years.

The Rev. Dr. George Frederick Pentecost, the noted evangelist, at one time associated with Dwight L. Moody, taken ill on the train, died in the emergency hospital in the Grand Central Terminal, New York, on Saturday night. He was on his way from his summer home, in Darien, Conn., to Brooklyn, where he was to have preached yesterday in St. James's Methodist Episcopal Church. Dr. Pentecost was an author as well as a clergyman, and in his religious work had travelled all over the world, and had planned to start on September 28 to attend Sunday school convention in Tokyo. Dr. Pentecost was born in Albion, Ill., September 23, 1842, the son of Hugh L.

and Emma Pentecost. His father, who served in the Mexican war, was the owner of a fleet of Mississippi steamboats, but they were destroyed by a disastrous flood, so the boy was taken from school at the age of twelve years and apprenticed to a printer in Evansville, Ind. After his father's death he worked at the trade in Kansas towns, and later became private secretary to the Governor of the Territory, assistant clerk of the Supreme Court, and clerk of the United States District Court.

In 1861 Dr. Pentecost became converted to the Baptist Church at a revival and entered Georgetown College to study for the ministry. But in 1862 he enlisted in the Union Army as a member of the Eighth Kentucky Cavalry, and was subsequently transferred to the staff of Gen. James Shields, and served until 1864, when he began preaching in the West and in Brooklyn and Boston. In 1887 he left the Baptist Church and became associated with Dwight L. Moody, the famous evangelist, and was his chief associate for three years, going to England with Moody in 1888 to assist in his campaign in that country and Scotland, and preaching daily for weeks to immense people in Glasgow.
