New York, May 14.—Two masked robbers held up the cashier of the Motor Truck Renting Corporation in West Forty Fourth street early tonight and escaped with \$700 which they took from a drawer in a safe. A girl cashier was struck over the right eye by one of the thieves with the butt-end of a revolver.

### CONFERENCE ON FURNISHINGS FOR NEW NURSES' HOME

A committee from the Women's Hospital Aid met with the commissioners of the general public hospital in the office of J. King Kelley yesterday afternoon for the purpose of going into the matter of the furnishing of the nurses' home. The delegation consisted of Mrs. W. W. White, convenor of the committee on furnishing, Mrs. B. Atherton Smith, president of the Aid, Mrs. J. Boyle Travers, secretary, and Mrs. Duncan Smith, treasurer. The commissioners present were Dr. Thomas Walker, chairman; J. King Kelley, Senator Daniel, Frank Flewelling, Miles Agar, Hon. Dr. Roberts and Dr. Crawford. The commissioners said that it was expected that the home would take about one year in the building. They agreed some uniform plan should be adopted in the furnishings. Dr. Roberts told of a magazine which deals exclusively with the subject of furnishings for such institutions and said he would procure some copies for the guidance of the committee which the aid should appoint. It was decided that Mrs. B. Duncan Smith, formerly superintendent of nurses in the general public hospital, who has recently visited several of the large nurses' homes in Canada and the United States should draw up a list of furnishings and should submit it to the commissioners for approval. The meeting was unanimously in favor of the furnishings being bought in St. John wherever it was possible that they should be.

### MONTREAL BANKER TAKES OWN LIFE

Montreal, May 14.—William Graham Browne, head of the firm of W. Graham Browne & Company, bond dealers, 224 St. James street, Montreal, manager of the Sovereign Bank at the time of its collapse some years ago, shot and killed himself in the wash room of the Bank of Ottawa building at 8.30 tonight. He was under arrest on a charge of theft of \$50,000 from the Royal Bank of Canada, and was in the charge of Detective George Lapierre of the Third Service Company of Canada, Limited. He had been arrested late in the afternoon at Coteau station and was being taken to the Montreal detective bureau when he asked the detective to be allowed to stop at his office to see his lawyer. While waiting there, he asked to be allowed to go to the wash-room. The lawyer arrived and the detective and he talked for some time. The former then began to notice that Browne had been away for a long time. He went to the wash-room and found his prisoner dead. The bullet had entered through the head and had pierced his brain.

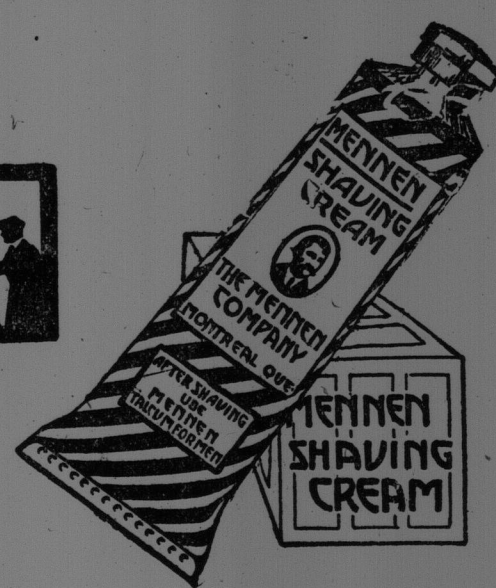

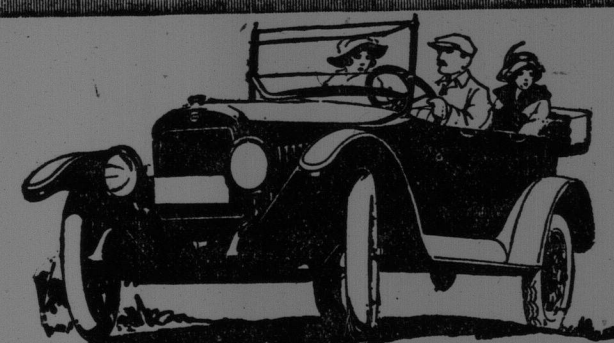
