THE NEW CITY COUNCIL

Now that the immigration congress is over, and the question of town-planning has been brought to the point where legislation is to be secured, and the new city charter has also gone to the legislature, it is time those interested in the city's welfare gave some attention to the question of securing candidates for the new city council of five members.

Mr. Bourassa has openly denounced the new system of city government. The commission plan will be on trial. Its supporters believe that with the principle of direct responsibility it will yield better results, even with weak men in office, than has been possible under the existing system.

PUBLIC NOTICE A Bill will be presented for enactment at the next Session of the Provincial Legislature to amend the Act of the General Assembly 11 Vic. Cap. 12, and 12 Vic. Cap. 68. The objects desired to be attained by this Bill are: (1) To reduce the maximum penalty for drunkenness to Two Dollars. (2) To empower the Police Magistrate in the case of the conviction of a person for drunkenness to direct that such person shall be detained until he has become sober, such detention, however, not to exceed one day.
