Guard Against Disaster.
The transportation committee of the American Olympic Committee held a conference on Thursday in New York after getting in touch with the customs house authorities and issued the following statement:—The passengers that make the trip to Stockholm on the steamship Finland, which has been chartered to take the team of American athletes and their friends to Stockholm, Sweden, where Uncle Sam's athletes will compete in the Olympic games in July, will be taken care of in the way of protection against any accident such as the Titanic met with as the Finland will be equipped with enough lifeboats and rafts to keep afloat at one time all persons on board, both passengers and crew.

Boston Marathon.
Boston, April 19.—Over an unusually sticky course, Mike Ryan, wearing the colors of the Irish-American A. C., of New York, won the Boston Marathon race today, cut the former record 21.18 seconds and practically assured himself a place on the American Olympic team.

The race today was run in a drizzling rain, which turned the surface of the road into slime and it was only by taking the sidewalks at intervals that the runners were able to make time.
