L'ETANG AS ST. JOHN'S RIVAL WINTER PORT.

Railway Officials Have Been Making Serious Visits There—The City Fathers Not Greatly Worried

The fact that leading C. P. R. and G. T. P. officials have recently visited L'Etang harbor, Charlotte county, has given rise to the belief that the port will become a rival to St. John.

A few months ago, E. G. Russell, of the Grand Trunk Pacific, carefully inspected L'Etang harbor, and it is believed he was sent by the line to examine the possibilities as a terminus, and report.

A few weeks ago, D. McNicol, general manager of the C. P. R., Arthur Piers, in charge of the steamship business of the same line, and Col. H. H. McLean, legal representative, spent some time in L'Etang. A few days following their departure, Captain Walsh, C. P. R. shore captain at St. John, inspected the harbor and approaches, then left for Montreal.

It has also been learned that J. Sutton Clark, who controls the rights at L'Etang, has been offered a large sum of money for his holdings.

Mayor White is not of the opinion that the prosperity of the winter port was threatened by the reported examinations at L'Etang. He said it was but natural for powerful corporations to have up-to-date and accurate knowledge respecting an outlet to the sea. His word was given to the fact that the development of St. John as a winter port was in any way menaced; and he did not think that the action of the C. P. R. was influenced by the attitude of the city toward C. P. R. ownership at Sand Point.

All MacTae, while admitting that L'Etang has a splendid harbor, said that the place could not rival St. John, for it could not furnish local freight. He saw no reason for alarm because of the officials' visits, and went in to explain that the great expense of transportation is not terminal charges. The serious expense is the car mileage question, hence shortness of railway route and having a good road with easy grades on which trains could be carried are far more important matters.

KING'S DAUGHTERS MEET.

The adjourned annual meeting of the King's Daughters' Guild was held last evening, and Mrs. J. E. Dean was elected president. Encouraging reports were submitted, and it was decided to commence after Nov. 1, Saturday afternoon classes for girls who will be taught sewing and housework.

The vice-presidents elected are Mrs. H. E. Ellis, Mrs. W. Purdy and Mrs. J. Foster. The vice-presidents, with five additional members, comprise the executive committee. The additional members are Miss McCormick, and Medienne Vaughan, Bullock, Henderson, and D. Puddington. Miss Pratt was elected treasurer, and Miss Rink recording secretary.

The total receipts for the last year amounted to \$254.53, the expenditures, \$247.75, and balance on hand, \$6.78. The following committees were appointed: Children's class, spiritual, entertainment, hospital and visiting, and educational.
