THE TURF

READVILLE BOOKIES ARRESTED.

READVILLE, MASS., AUG. 27.—The unlooked for victory of Ed. Custer in the American Horse Breeders' Futurity stake for three year olds and the arrest of the bookies charged with book making, or being present, were the features of the second day's grand circuit meet at the Readville track today. The other stake event, the Norfolk for the 2000 pacers, was won by Argosy, who took all three heats and races. El Milagro took the three heats in the 212 trotting race without difficulty. The Futurity stake was valued at \$7000 and is the first of the large Futurities of the year. Gay Bling was the favorite, but came on the track slightly lame. At the start of the first heat he remained in second place, and in the second heat, when he moved up, and at the turn was half a length in the lead. Cognito came up strong and carried the leader to a break in the stretch and won by a length. Ed. Custer was fourth.

In the second heat Ed. Custer kept close to Cognito and at the far turn the latter broke and the Wisconsin horse won easily.

Ed. Custer in the third heat led from wire to wire. The time of the first heat was within a quarter of a second of the world's record for three year old stallions, held by Ceresus.

Ardele, the Geers entry, was the favorite for the Norfolk, but Cox kept Argosy close to Ardele in the first heat, and the latter was arrested, together with the lead and finished very far in 20th, beating the record for the stake of 2:04, made by Morning Star. The next two heats were easy for the New Hampshire horse.

It was not until the final heat of the 212 trot that El Milagro was challenged by Jenny Scott, but the mare did not show the necessary speed to catch the gelding.

There was no pool selling today, but several of the bookmakers offered odds, and two of them were arrested, together with four spectators in the betting room, and taken to Dedham, where they were held for a few days.

The English Breeders' Association, said after the races today that there would be pool selling on the races at the track tomorrow, acting under the decision of the Dedham court today.

THE ST. JOHN RACES.

All was excitement, the drivers in front saw the runaway coming on them and shaking their whips, managed to keep him off. Utatlan passed them all in the run and could not be stopped until the stables were reached. The others continued the contest.
