BLEACHING WHEAT FLOUR.

The Lancel, London, agrees fully with the action of the Bureau of Chemistry of the Department of Agriculture in this country in ruling against the bleaching of wheat flour. "The public," says the Lancel, "would be well advised to abandon the fallacious notion that the whiteness of bread is a mark of its quality. On the contrary, it nearly always means an insipid, unpalatable bread, and an attractive flavor is a factor of considerable importance in connection with the digestibility of food. The destruction of the natural color of flour by bleaching agents synchronizes with the destruction of its attractive flavor. Such tampering with the staple of life should be made illegal."

RURAL MAIL DELIVERY.
