DEATH OF BRONN'S WIDOW. — Died at No 11 St George's-terrace, Regent Park London, Ann Isabella, Baroness Noel Byron, widow of the late Lord Byron. This lady, who was born in 1764, was the only daughter and heir of Sir Ralph Mordaunt, Bart, by the sister and co-heir of the second Viscount and ninth Baron Wentworth. On the death of the other co-heir Lord Searisale, 1855 she succeeded to the barony by writ, the viscount becoming extinct. She was married the great part in 1815, but the union, as well known, was a most unhappy one for both the husband and wife. The only child, Ada, was married to Earl Colclough, and died in 1832.
