GREYHOUND LINES
WITH CANADIANS
Poses as Most Progressive
Ruler in India and Commits
Cruelties and Barbarisms of
Hideous Savagery.

All over the world the Gaekwar of Baroda is in bad with the people of the British Empire. He may explain and apologize about his insolence to the King and Queen at the Durbar, but the moving pictures seem to have caught him with the goods, and the Gaekwar's former popularity has vanished in thin air.

T. H. Preston, representative of the Canadian Press at the Coronation Durbar, writes about the Gaekwar like this:
"This individual poses as the most progressive ruler in India, and as having introduced in his state such advanced measures as technical education and compulsory school attendance. He is notorious for his insolence to the British and is not so civilized as to be above making sport for himself and his guests by getting elephants or bullocks drunk and then inciting them to fight."
In addition, the Rani, his wife, who like himself has travelled considerably, is said to be the most pronounced seditionist in India.

Before the ceremony he asked his British resident, (each native ruler has a representative of Great Britain associated with him) to write the King and ask that he (the King) should receive him standing—in other words as an equal. He was advised to take time to reflect before sending such a message, but after doing so, persisted in the request, and endeavored to induce other native rulers to take the same course. Needless to say, his request was not granted, with the result that he appeared before the King in Oriental costume of ordinary white linen and made his bow in a manner which seemed to indicate disrespect rather than respect, and attracted the attention of all present.

The outcome is that he has been obliged to make a public apology and to deny that he meant any disrespect or is not loyal to the King-Emperor. Had he not taken this course, he would probably have been humiliated, but he is compelled to put up with a salute of something less than twenty-one guns, which he is now entitled to receive when ever he visits a place in which a British battery is located.

The great surprise of the Durbar came at its close. Their Imperial Majesties had returned to the Shamiana, and the ceremonial was apparently in its penultimate stage, when, to the surprise of all present, the King-Emperor stepped to the front and, addressing the Durbar, made the unexpected announcement that it was his will and purpose to change the seat of his government from Calcutta to Delhi, and to alter the boundaries of the Province of Bengal.

The announcement was of such importance as to cause the Durbar itself for a time to sink into insignificance. The Hindus, both Hindu and Mohammedan, seemed for the most part to be delighted at the thought that Delhi, the Imperial City, was once more to become the centre of political power. Others felt that the policy of Lord Curzon in creating a separate province out of East Bengal and Assam, which had been the subject of much hostile criticism by the Bengalis of Calcutta, was being rudely reversed, while consternation reigned in Bengal, not merely because Calcutta was being deprived of capital honors which she had long enjoyed, but also because the most important administrative changes had been determined upon by the Viceroy and the Secretary of State for India without warning, and without consultation with the people most directly affected.

The official correspondence showed that the changes had been determined upon as far back as August last, and hence the secret had been closely kept.

"Already loud clamors are being heard from Calcutta, but hostile criticism will be stifled for a time by reason of the fact that the King has accepted the responsibility of announcing the changes, and the feeling of personal loyalty to him is too strong to admit of anything being said or done which would make his visit uncomfortable, even to Calcutta. As for the changes themselves, particularly the removal of the capital to Delhi, a very strong case is made out in the correspondence passing between the Viceroy and Downing street."

DANGER OF FLOOD
TO RESIDENTS OF
CAMAS INCREASES

Madrid, Feb. 9.—The floods in the eastern provinces are rapidly becoming worse. The Ministry of Public Works arrived in Seville this morning to investigate the damage and the condition of the suffering population. He proceeded later to the village of Camas, to three miles from the capital, where the situation of the inhabitants is very critical.

DIVIDEND OF GRAND
TRUNK INCREASED

London, Feb. 9.—The half yearly statement of the Grand Trunk Railway shows a surplus of £466,900 admitting of a dividend of 4 per cent. on the guaranteed stock and first and second preference, and one and a half per cent. on the third preference. This is an increase of 1 per cent. over the previous yearly dividend, which was paid on May 5 last.

Some good work has been done by this local branch in the past, though during the last few months it became almost inactive in consequence of the resignation of Rev. B.
