Washington, Sept. 24.—The world's wheat crop this year for the principal countries, which has reported, including the United States, is 1,848,482,000 bushels, an increase of 2.3 per cent. over 1916, according to reports from the International Institute of Agriculture at Rome, made public today by the Department of Agriculture.

The world's barley crop is 684,250,000, an increase of 2.4 per cent; the rye crop, 212,000,000 bushels, an increase of 10.1 per cent; the oats crop, 1,995,000,000 bushels, an increase of 1.8 per cent, and the corn crop, 3,278,800,000 bushels, an increase of 2.5 per cent.

REVOLT AGAINST BISHOP FALLON IS SPREADING

Ten Thousand French Canadians Decline to Permit Him to Confirm Children—Member of Legislature Charges That Bishop Has Lost Control of Diocese.

Windsor, Sept. 25.—It is estimated that ten thousand French-Canadians from Chatham, Wallaceburg, Big Pine, Fairport, Stoney Point, Belle River and the Ford City parish gathered at the meeting held on Sunday and pledged themselves not to permit their children to be confirmed by Bishop Fallon and not to attend any service where he is presiding.

The male members are boycotting Our Lady of the Lake church. A resolution was passed supporting the request of the protesting members of Our Lady of the Lake church demanding investigation by the attorney-general into the rioting when Father Laurendeau took charge.

Sevin Ducharme, M.P.P., one of the speakers, deplored the lack of tact of Bishop Fallon, who he estimated had lost control of his diocese.
