He did not speak to any one, only to say: "I've murdered! I murdered everybody—everybody!" This he would close with a blood-curdling laugh. It was generally believed that he killed both Burley and Benton.

A few years since Brown died, but gave no clue or said anything more than the above disjointed ravings in regard to the supposed murder.

The finding of the remains has again brought the subject forward. That the bones are those of Benton, and that he was in some way made away with and buried by his brother-in-law, no one now doubts.
